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EVO Dashboard Overview

EVO Dashboard was designed based on merchant feedback and technical evaluations of existing EVO products. It was determined through these reviews that there was a great benefit for merchants to be able to conduct reporting and transaction management within the same system that contains the payment acceptance workflow. Thus, Dashboard was created to consolidate the Virtual Terminal and the reporting and transaction capabilities into a single, fast, scalable, and easy to use product for mobile or web-based users.

Note: Dashboard functionality is permissions based – certain features may or may not be visible based on the user’s permission settings.

First Time Login

Setting a Password

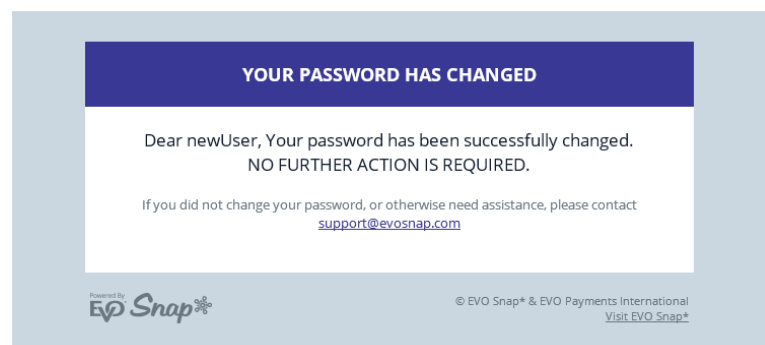


Fig.1 (left) and Fig. 2 (right) – the Change Password page and the email sent to merchants upon a successful password change.

Upon logging into Dashboard for the first time, the first page a merchant will encounter is the Change Password page (Figure 1). Here, the merchant will enter their current, temporary password, as well as what they would like their new password to be. This new password must have at least 7 characters, an uppercase letter, a lowercase letter, a number, and a special character. Required fields turn red when left blank, and the “Save” button will turn blue when enabled. A success message appears upon a successful password change, and an email informing the merchant of the password change is sent to the email address that the merchant registered with (Figure 2).

Updating Security Questions

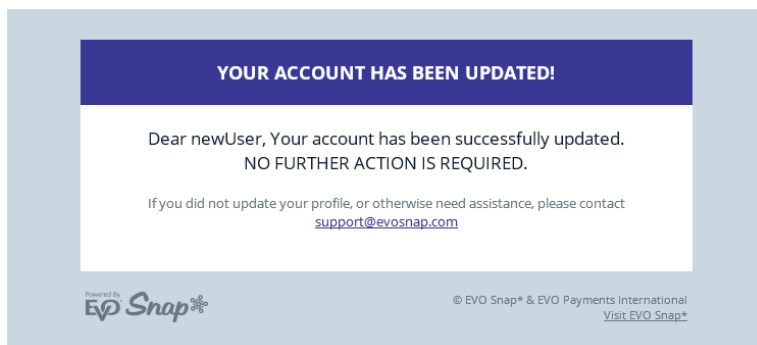


Fig. 4 (left) – the email message a merchant receives upon successful update of security question answers.

Next, the merchant will set the security questions for their account in case of a lost or forgotten password (Figure 3). The current password must be entered correctly for security questions to be successfully set. The merchant must choose three different security questions from a list of security question options – please note that these questions **cannot be changed**, so merchants should choose their security questions carefully. Once the security questions are successfully updated, the merchant will be brought to the Dashboard homepage and an email informing the merchant of the security question update is sent to the email address that the merchant registered with (Figure 4).

Fig. 3 (right) – the Set Security Questions page. Merchants must select three security questions they will use in order to retrieve a lost or forgotten password. Note, these questions **cannot be changed** after being set here. Answers can be changed in the merchant profile.

Homepage



Merchants can navigate to <http://dashboard.evopayments.com> to access the Dashboard login page (Figure 5).

Note: Merchants currently using <http://vtlite.evossnap.com> as their URL will need to update to the new Dashboard URL to continue supporting merchants. Contact TS@evopayments.com for more information.

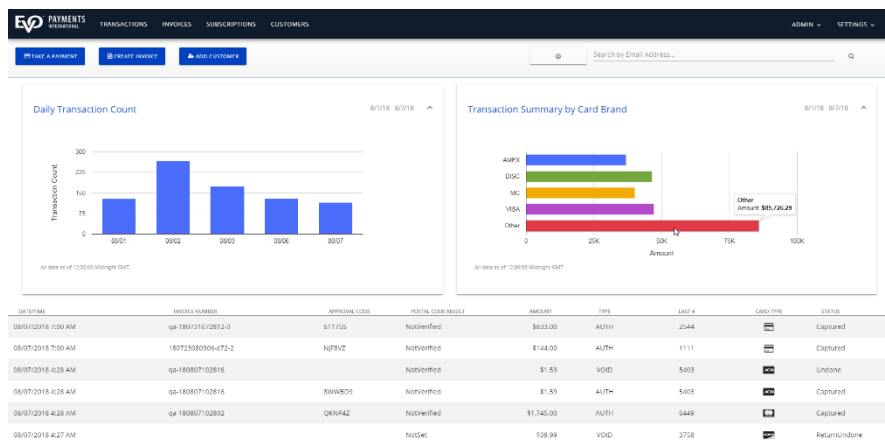


Fig. 6 (left) - the Dashboard homepage. Note that if the cursor hovers over a bar on either graph, a pop-up with more details about that specific heading appears; that feature can be seen here, demonstrated in the Transaction Summary by Card Brand graph.

After logging in with their user name and password, merchants will be brought to the Dashboard homepage (Figure 6).

Many features can be accessed through the menus and buttons on this page, such as the basic features of taking a payment, creating an invoice, and adding a customer. Most notably, the homepage features two graphs displaying the daily transaction count and the transaction summary by card brand for the past week, as well as a detailed, clickable list of the most recent transactions (Figure 6). Clicking on the EVO Payments International logo in the top, left corner will return the user to the homepage from any page in Dashboard.

Also, note that the date range for each graph can be found at the top, right corner in each graph's field.

Transactions

Take a Payment

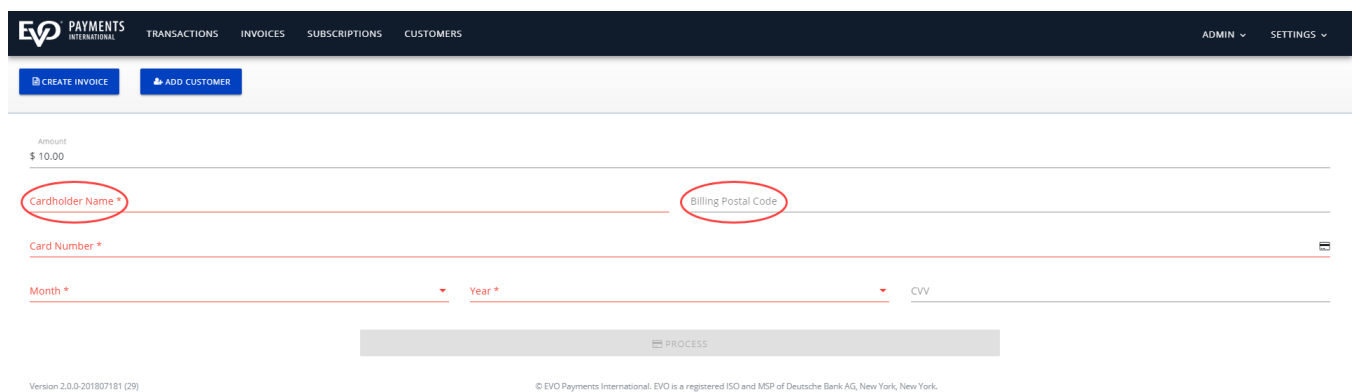


Fig. 7 – the Take a Payment page. Note that required fields return red when left blank. Also note that since the user is on the Take a Payment page, that button no longer appears as a navigation option

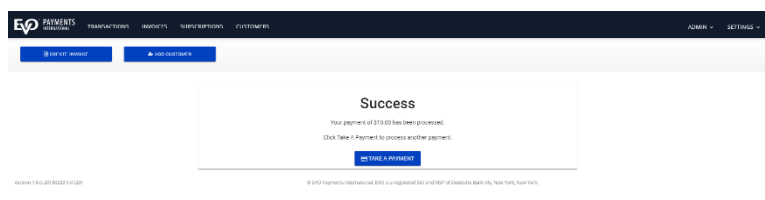
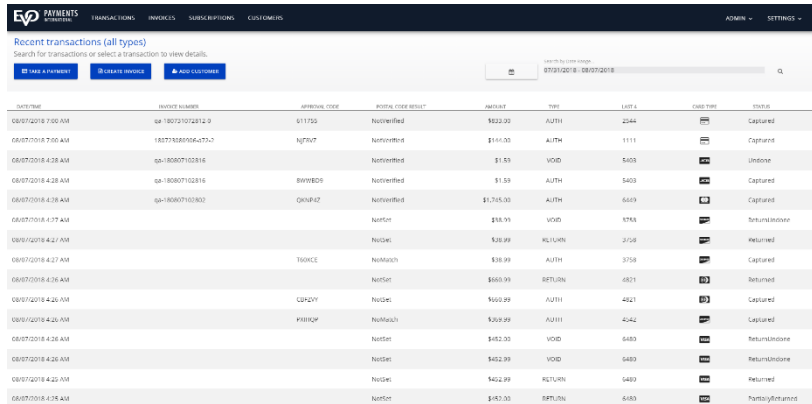


Fig. 8 (left) – The success message returned after a successful transaction payment.

Clicking on the blue “Take a Payment” button on the Dashboard homepage brings up the quick-payment page. Fields marked with an asterisk must be filled in and will return red if clicked on and left blank, as can be seen in Figure 7. The “Process” button will turn blue when the fields are filled out properly, indicating that the user is ready to proceed with the payment. Upon a successful payment, a success message is returned with an option to take another quick charge payment (Figure 8).

If the payment is partially approved or declined, an error message is returned. If the payment is partially approved, Dashboard will subsequently void the transaction.

Recent Transactions Page

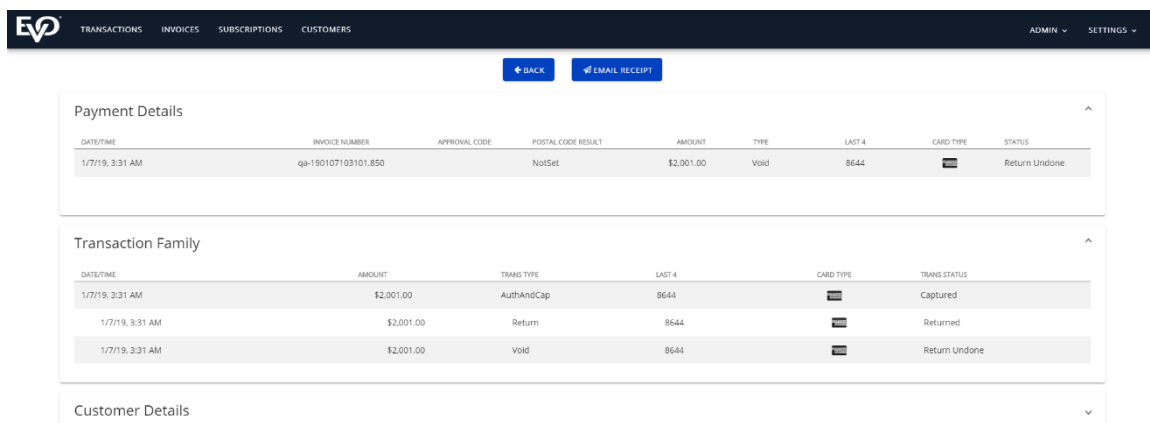
Fig. 9 (left) – the Recent Transactions page.

Clicking on the “Transactions” heading at the top of every page brings the user to the Recent Transactions page (Figure 9). Only the transactions from the most recent 180 days will be shown in the list via infinite scrolling, but a merchant can search for a specific transaction through a particular date range, card type, invoice number, approval code, or transaction status. Clicking on a transaction from the list or search results brings up a Payment Details page for that transaction.

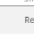
Each transaction in the list is shown with the date and time it was processed, the postal code result, the amount of the transaction, the transaction type, last four digits of the card used, the card type, the current transaction status, and, if applicable, the invoice number and approval code.




Payment Details Page

Clicking on a particular transaction on either the Dashboard homepage or in the list of transactions on the Recent Transactions page brings up the Payment Details page for that transaction. The buttons at the top of the page represent the actions available for the transaction, as seen in Figure 10. The “Back” button returns the user to the Recent Transactions list.

Note: Transactions can only be voided on the same day they were processed (until midnight in the user’s time zone). If that time has passed, the “Void” option will not appear.

Fig. 10 – the Payment Details page. The Transaction Family section shows the transaction history and details for each transaction. The only available action for this transaction is “Email Receipt”. Transactions in the “Transaction Family” section can be clicked on for more details about each step in the transaction’s history. The customer’s general information, billing and/or shipping addresses can be edited and the customer can be invoiced by expanding the “Customer Details” section, as well.

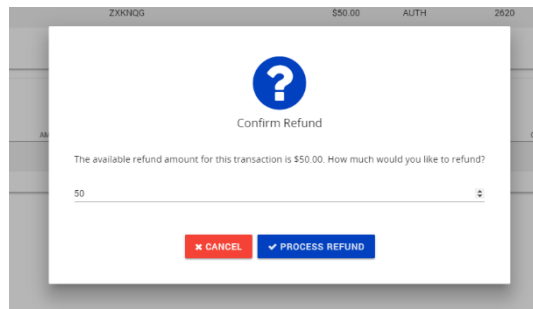


Fig. 11 – the “Confirm Refund” pop-up. Note that a partial refund can be issued by entering an amount less than the available refund amount listed.

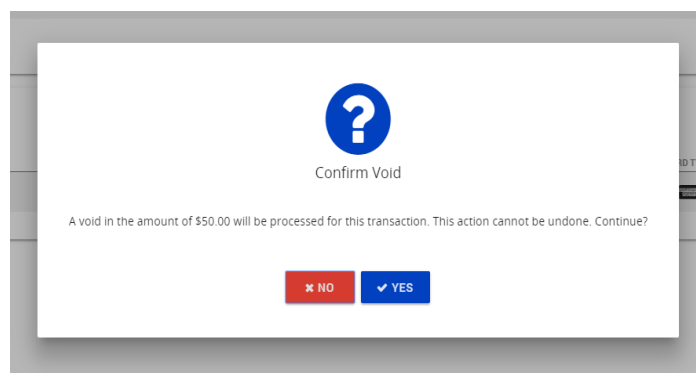


Fig. 13 – “Process Void” confirmation. Note that voids can only be processed on the same day the transaction was processed.

When a user clicks on one of the available transaction options, a pop-up appears asking them to confirm the action they’ve requested (Figures 11, 12, 13, and 14).

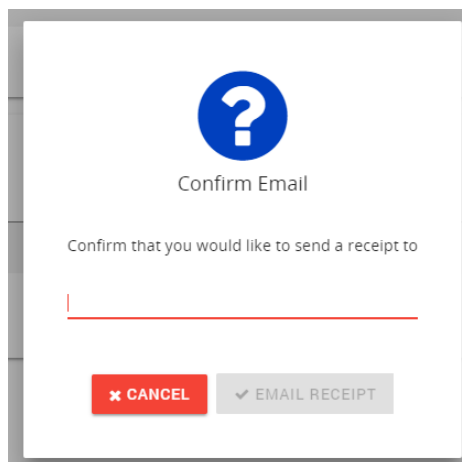


Fig. 14 – “Confirm Email” pop-up. Merchants can enter a specific email address that they wish to send a receipt to here.

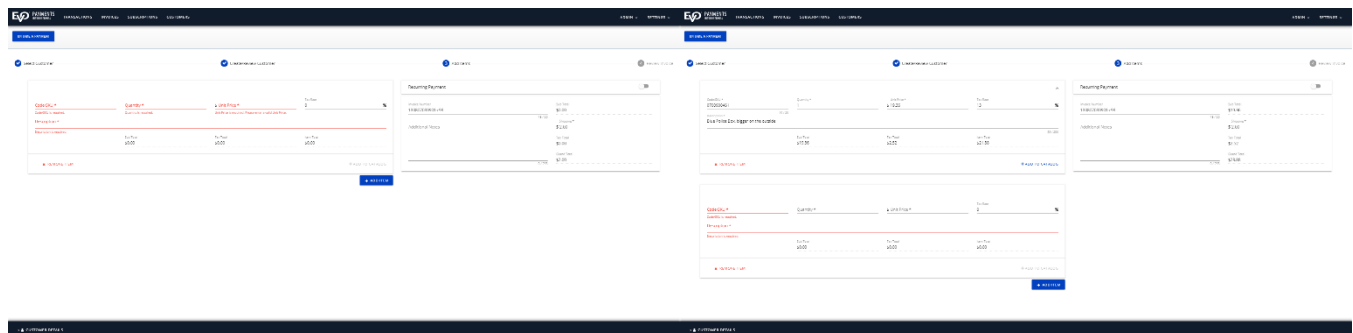


Fig. 17 – the Add Items page for invoices. Note that fields that are required turn red if left blank. The tax rate is applied as a percentage to two decimal places. Also, the “Quantity” field can only be populated with an integer value and decimals render this field invalid.

After reviewing the customer's information, the merchant can add items to the invoice either from the catalog or create a new item. Fields marked with an asterisk are required and will turn red if opened and left blank, as seen in Figure 17.

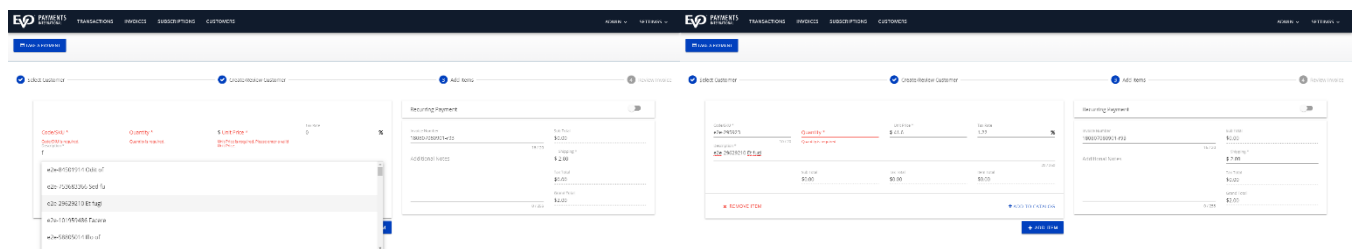


Fig. 18 - the Add Items page for invoices showing the Catalog type-ahead feature. The top image shows the list of catalog items that contain the entered character and the bottom shows the auto-populated fields once an item is selected.

If the merchant is adding an item from the catalog, the Code/SKU and Description fields have a “type-ahead” feature that will pull up existing catalog items with the same character or characters entered into the field (Figure 18). Once the user finds the code/SKU or description of the item they wish to add to the invoice, clicking on it will auto-populate all other fields with saved information from the catalog item.

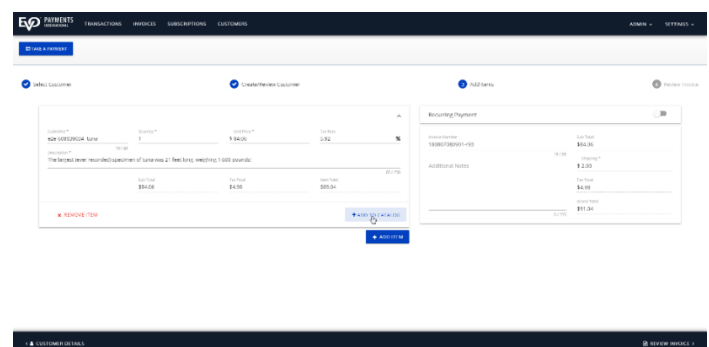
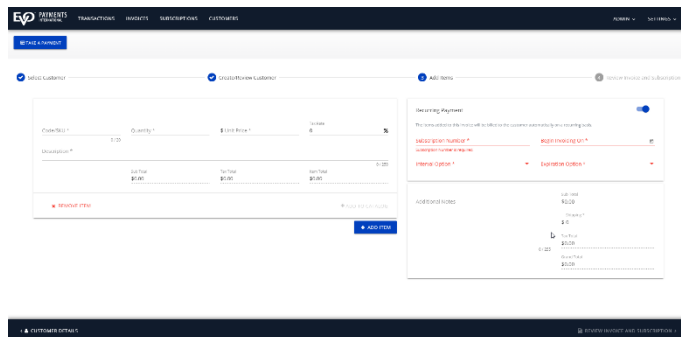


Fig. 19 (right) - the Add Items page for invoices showing the “Add to Catalog” button enabled because the description changed.

If a new Code/SKU or Description is entered, the “Add to Catalog” button becomes enabled, allowing the user to quickly add the item to the catalog (Figure 19) to be used again in future created invoices. Or, if an existing catalog item is selected and then modified, the user has the option to save that change as a new catalog item.

Please note that the “Quantity” field will only accept whole number values – decimal values are invalid.



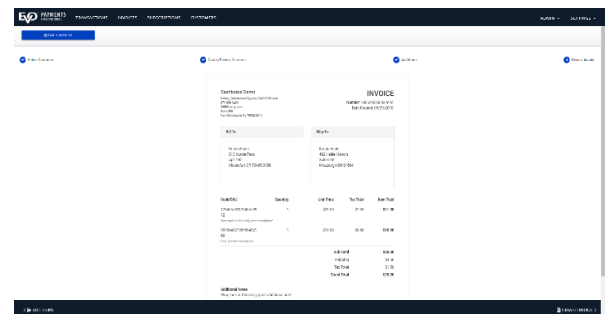
If the “Recurring Payment” toggle is enabled, a new field expands with fields related to creating a subscription (Figure 20). For more information, please see the [Subscriptions](#) section.

Fig. 20 (left) – the Add Items section of the invoice creation workflow showing the Recurring Payment toggle enabled. Note that all fields are required to continue with the process of creating an invoice or subscription.

Once the fields are populated, the merchant can click on “Review Invoice” and also “4: Review Invoice” to preview the invoice.

On the review page (Figure 21), the merchant can review all the information entered in the creation process. When the merchant has completed their review, they can click on the “Create Invoice” button to create the invoice and automatically be navigated to the Review Invoice page.

Fig. 21 (right) – the Review Invoice page. Merchants can review the customer information, as well as the invoice item details for the invoice. Additional notes will appear in the “Additional Notes” section if added on the previous page – if no notes are added, the “Additional Notes” section will not appear.



Recent Invoices

Clicking on the “Invoices” heading next to the EVO Payments logo brings the user to the Recent Invoices page (Figure 22), which has a clickable list of invoices. Details about recent invoices, including date created, invoice number, customer name, invoice amount, payment type, and invoice status are included for each invoice in the list. If the specific invoice a merchant is looking for is not in the recent invoices list, merchants can search for a specific invoice using a date range, invoice number, or invoice status for invoices created up to one year ago.

Fig. 22 – the Recent Invoices page. Merchants can click on a recent invoice from the list or can search for a specific invoice using the search function.

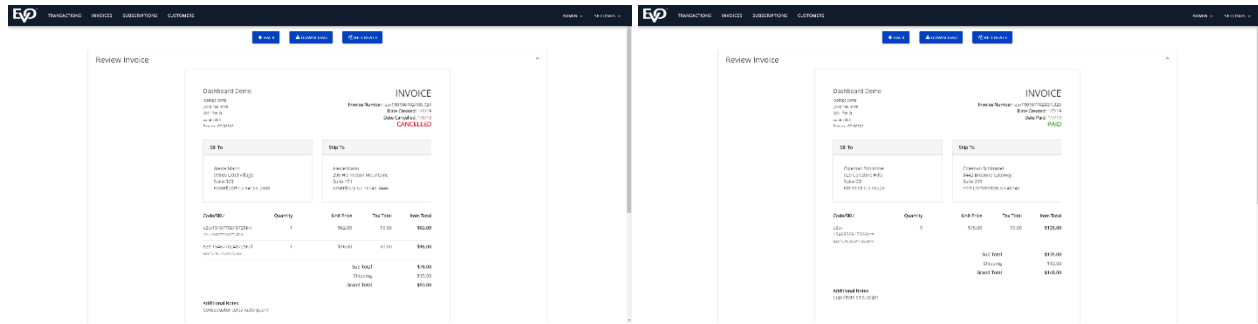


Fig. 24 (left) and Fig. 25 (right) – Cancelled and Paid invoices. Note that the only actions available for these invoices are “Download” and “Re-create”.

Clicking on an invoice from the list brings up the page to review the invoice; in the top, right corner of the invoice, the invoice status will be shown and will appear in red if cancelled, green if paid, and yellow if pending. Depending on the status of the invoice, different actions for the invoice will appear at the top of the page. For example, the invoice in Figure 23 is pending payment (shown by the yellow “Pending” in the top, right corner), so there are options available to cancel the invoice, copy a link to the invoice payment form, download the invoice, pay the invoice now, or re-create the invoice. However, the invoice in Figure 24 has been cancelled, and the invoice in Figure 25 has been paid; therefore, the only actions available for those invoices are “Download” and “Re-create”.

Fig. 23 – the top of the page to review a specific invoice. Note that this invoice matches the invoice that was created using the Create an Invoice workflow. The four buttons at the top of the page correspond to the actions available for that invoice.

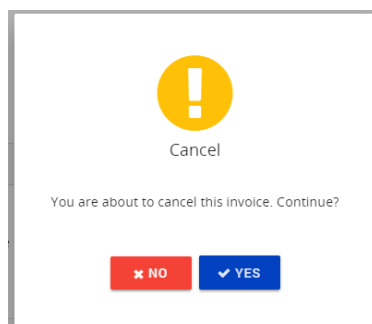
No matter the status of the invoice, each invoice will have a “Related Transactions” section at the bottom of the page (Figure 26). The transactions listed there are associated with that particular invoice; some transaction states are not visible at this time, but will be visible in a future release. For further information, the user must select the transaction state from the list to be navigated to the Payment Details page. Also, if the transaction was declined, the transaction will not be included in the list.

As mentioned before, there are five actions that can be taken with an invoice that is pending payment:

Cancel

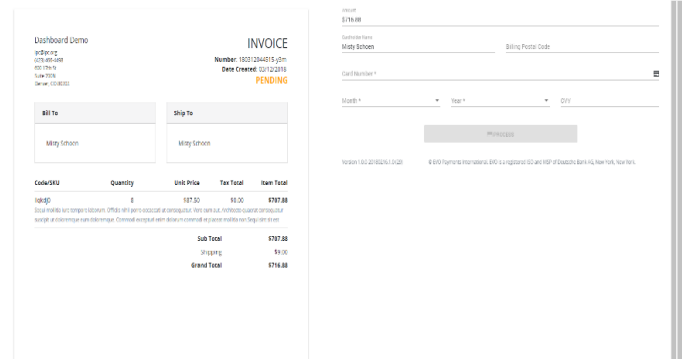


Selecting the “Cancel” option brings up the pop-up seen in Figure 27. Clicking “Yes” responds with a success message confirming the invoice was cancelled, and the invoice will update its status to “Cancelled” as well. A date stamp is added to the invoice to reflect the date the invoice was cancelled.

Copy Link

Selecting the “Copy Link” option copies the link to the invoice so that a merchant can paste that link to make it accessible to the customer. Following that link brings the customer to the invoice payment page (Figure 28). All the fields on the invoice payment page are editable except for the amount, and fields marked with an asterisk are required.



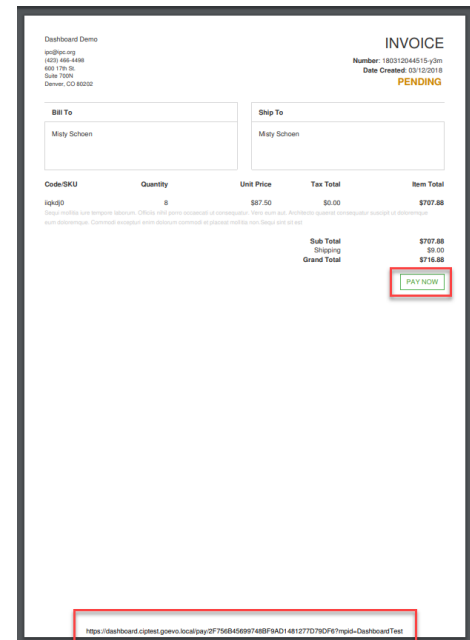

A 5-minute countdown is triggered 25 minutes after opening this page, and when it reaches the zero-mark, the session expires and the customer must refresh the page or open a new page from the original copied link.

Download

Selecting the “Download” option downloads a copy of the invoice in its current state. This option is available for all three invoice statuses. A pending invoice that is downloaded has a payment web address link at the bottom and a “Pay Now” button that both redirect to the Invoice Payment page when clicked (Figure 29).



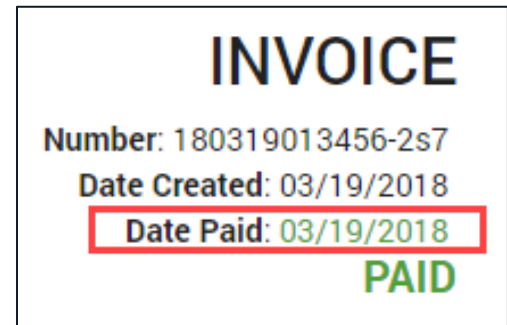

Fig. 29 (right) – a downloaded pending invoice. The red boxes show the “Pay Now” button and the payment web address link that can be copied and pasted into a web browser which both redirect to the Invoice Payment page.

Pay Now

Selecting the “Pay Now” option brings up a page identical to the invoice payment page from Figure 19, with a copy of the invoice to the left and the payment application embedded on the page to the right. Again, all the fields on the invoice payment page are editable except for the amount, and fields marked with asterisks are required. Once the payment is processed, the invoice status will update to “Paid” and a time-stamp will appear on the invoice with the date it was paid (Figure 30).

Fig. 30 (right) – a closer look at the “Date Paid” time stamp on a paid invoice.



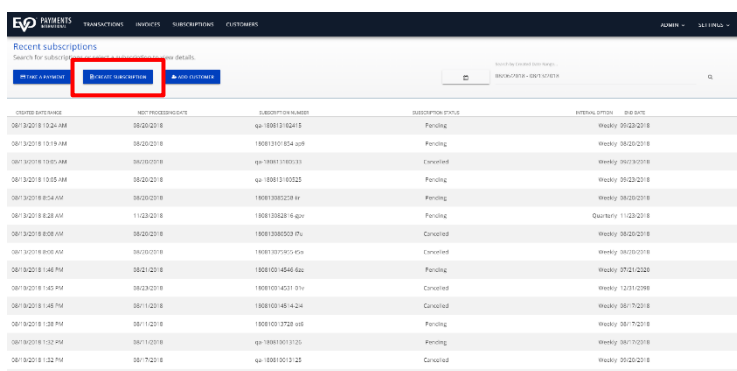
Re-create

Clicking on the “Re-create” button brings the user to the Add Items page from the invoice creation workflow. The re-created invoice has the same information, except for tax rate, as the original invoice; this includes the same customer and customer information, billing address, shipping address, items, and notes. This information can be edited by going back to prior steps in the invoice creation process. This action allows for merchants to quickly and easily recreate previous invoices.

Subscriptions

Create a Subscription

Clicking on the Subscription heading brings the user to a “Recent Subscriptions” page, and from here, the merchant can select the blue “Create Subscription” button, which begins the subscription creation process (Figure 31). The process of creating a subscription is the same as the invoice creation process for the first two steps of selecting a customer and creating/reviewing the

customer details. However, on the Add Items page, there is a “Recurring Payment” section opened with details for creating a subscription.

Merchants can select a date to begin invoicing on and then choose how often they’d like to automatically send the invoice to the subscription customer: weekly, every other week, monthly, quarterly, or yearly. Merchants can also select an expiration option to decide how the subscription will end: a specific number of occurrences, a specific end date, or merchants can choose for the subscription to not expire. Once created, merchants will need to cancel and recreate the subscription in order to change any of these details.

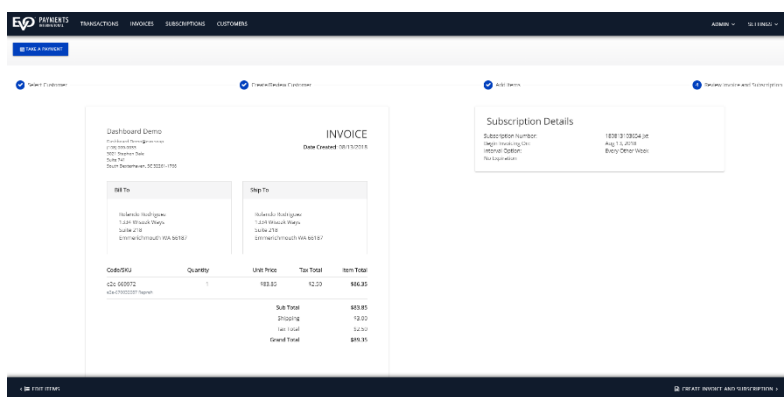


Fig. 32 (left) – the “Review Subscription Details” page. Here, merchants can review their subscription details before proceeding with creating the subscription.

On the “Review Invoice and Subscription” page, merchants can see the invoice they’ve created, as well as the specific subscription details they have selected (Figure 32). Merchants can then click “Create Invoice and Subscription” to finish creating the subscription.

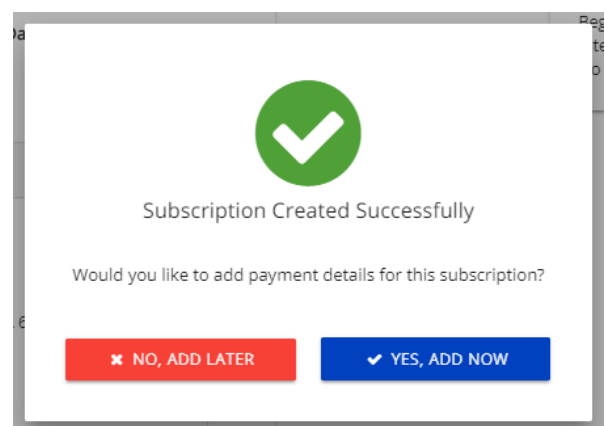
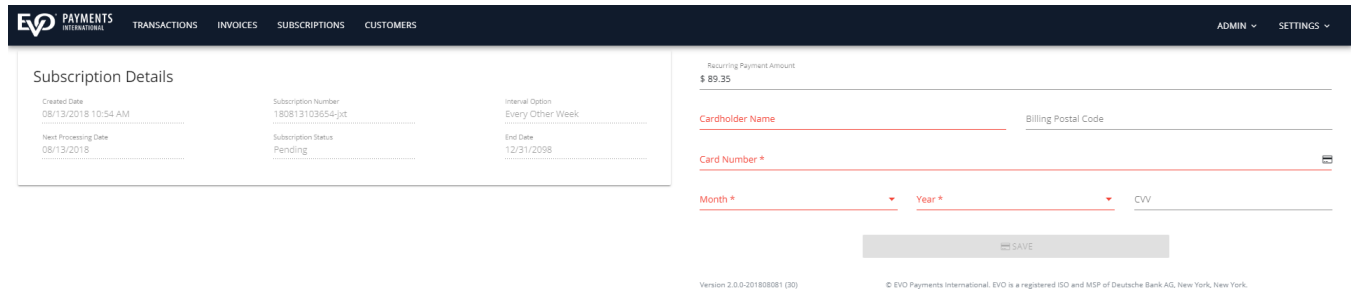


Fig. 33 – the pop-up that appears upon successful subscription creation.

Upon successful creation of a subscription, a pop-up appears saying the subscription has been successfully created and asks the merchant if they’d like to add the customer’s payment data now or later (Figure 33). If they would like to add payment details now, clicking “Yes, Add Now” takes the merchant to a page where they can review the subscription details and add payment data for the customer (Figure 34). If the merchant does not want to add payment details at that time, clicking on “No, Add Later” brings the merchant to the subscription details page.

IMPORTANT: Invoices will be generated automatically based on the subscription settings chosen by the merchant during creation, but will **NOT** be billed to customers automatically. Merchants must send the invoice or “Add Payment Link” to their customer.

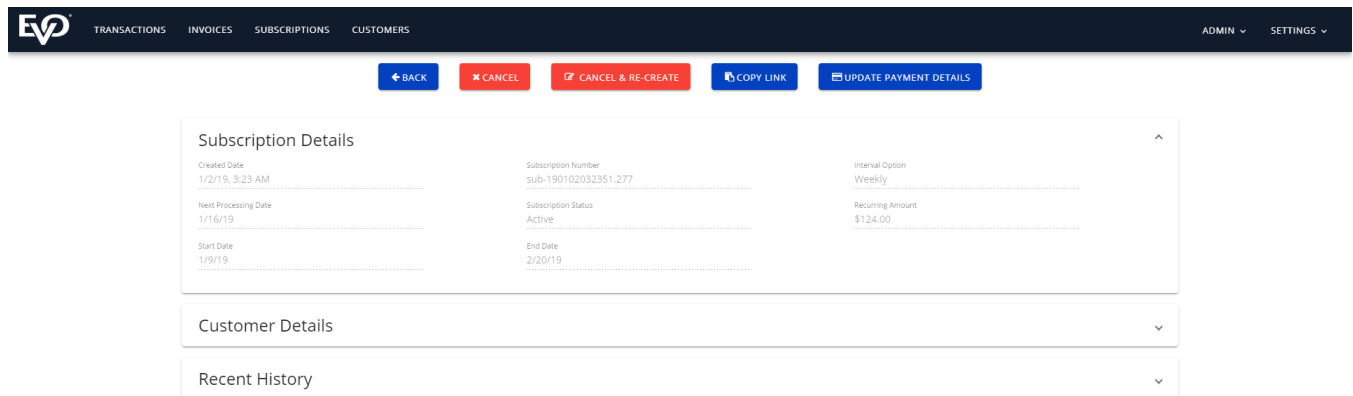
Recent Subscriptions

Clicking on the “Subscriptions” heading next to the EVO Payments logo brings the user to the Recent Subscriptions page, as seen in Figure 31, which has a clickable list of created subscriptions. Details about recent subscriptions, including date created, next processing date, subscription number, subscription status, interval option, and end date are included for each subscription in the list. If the specific subscription a merchant is looking for is not in the recent subscriptions list, merchants can search for a specific invoice using a created date range, exact subscription number, or subscription status.

Subscription Details Page

Clicking on a subscription from the list brings up the page to review the subscription details; the creation date, subscription number, interval option, next processing date, subscription status, and end date are all shown on this page, and there are expandable fields detailing the subscription customer’s information, such as billing and shipping addresses, as well as a recent history section showing a clickable list of the invoices from the subscription’s history (Figure 35).

Depending on the status of the subscription, different actions for the subscription will appear at the top of the page. For active and pending subscriptions, the four actions available for those subscriptions are “Cancel”, “Cancel and Re-create”, “Copy Link”, and “Update Payment Details”. For cancelled and completed subscriptions, the only action available is “Re-create”.



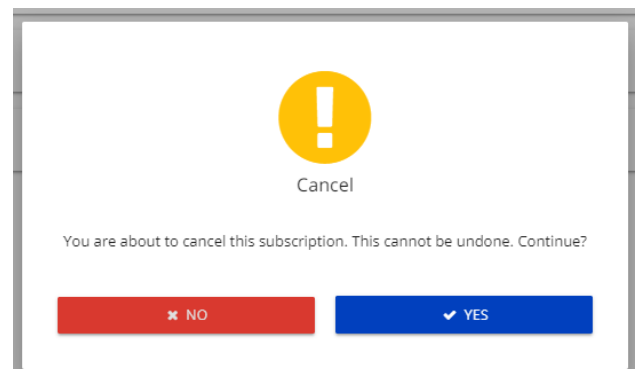

Cancel

Selecting the “Cancel” option brings up the pop-up seen in Figure 36. Clicking “Yes” responds with a success message confirming the subscription was cancelled, and the Subscription Details will update the subscription status to “Cancelled”.

Cancel and Re-create

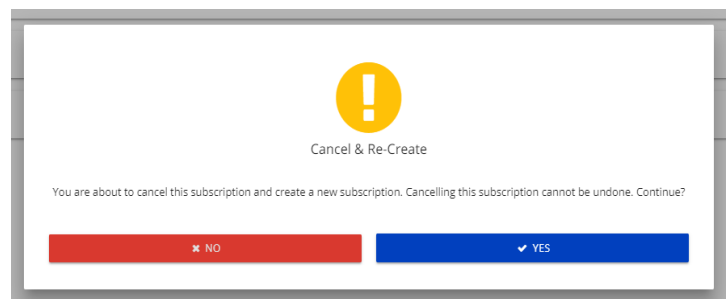


Fig. 37 – the Cancel and Re-create Subscription button pop-up.

Selecting the “Cancel and Re-create” option brings up the pop-up seen in Figure 37. Selecting “Yes” responds with a success message confirming the subscription was cancelled and prompting the merchant to continue setting up a new subscription for this customer. All of the cancelled subscription’s items, interval rate, and shipping details are copied into the “Add Items” section of the subscription creation process - the “Begin Invoicing Date”, “Expiration Option”, and tax rate need to be re-entered by the merchant. The merchant can edit any and all of these details, including the customer to be invoiced, before reviewing and creating the subscription.

Note: the only way to update subscription details, such as interval option and expiration option, is to cancel the active subscription and re-create a new one with the desired details.

Copy Link

Selecting the “Copy Link” option copies the link to subscription so that a merchant can paste the copied link to make the subscription details and payment application accessible to the customer. Following that link brings the customer to the subscription details and payment application (as seen in Figure 34). All the fields on the subscription recurring payment page are editable except for the amount, and fields marked with an asterisk are required.

Update Payment Details

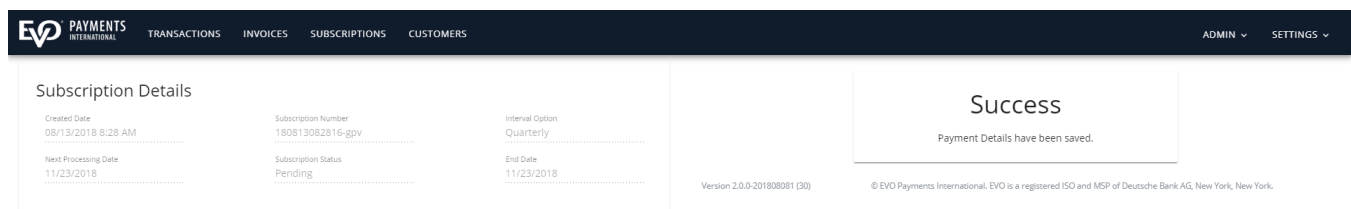


Fig. 38 – the Update Subscription Payment Details page showing the success message returned when the customer’s payment details have been successfully updated.

Selecting the “Update Payment Details” option brings the user to a page with the subscription details and a section to add payment information for the subscription. Payment details added here will be used for all future payments of the subscription unless updated again. A success message appears when the payment details have been successfully saved (Figure 38).

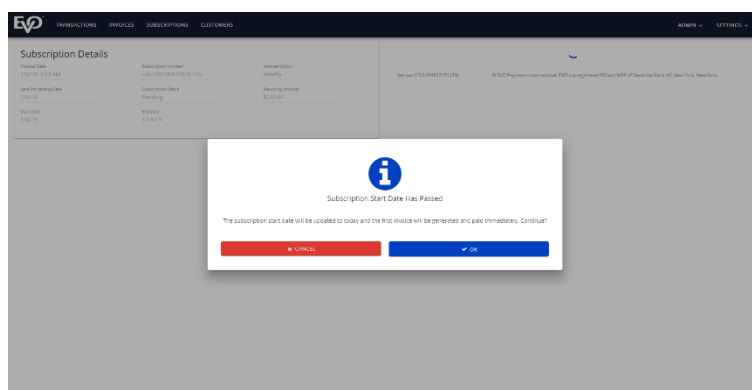


Fig. 39 (left) – the message that appears when a customer or merchant tries to update the payment details of a subscription with a start date and next processing date are both in the past by at least one day. This message appears for the “Update Payment Details” button and for the copied link that merchants can provide to customers to update their payment details.

Note that merchants and customers are unable to update a pending subscription’s payment details if the subscription start date and the next processing date are both in the past by at least one day. If attempted, a message appears informing the user that the start date has passed and that the subscription start date will be updated to the current day; it also states that the first invoice for the subscription will be generated and paid immediately with the new payment details that the merchant or customer enters (Figure 39).

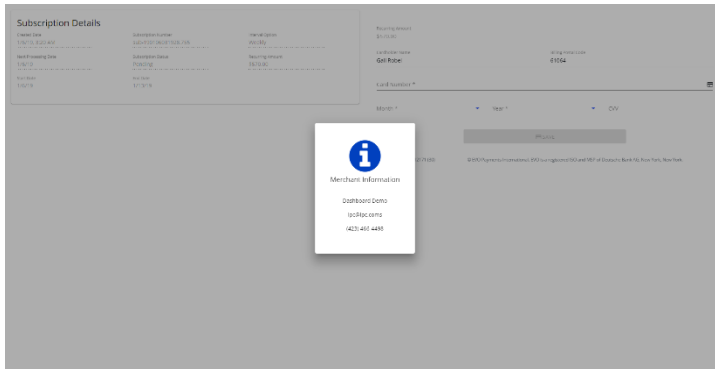


Fig. 40 (left) – the merchant contact information pop-up that occurs when a customer accesses the copied link of a subscription with a start date and next processing date at least one day in the past and declines the warning message. Note that customers are not able to edit any payment information without contacting the merchant.

Selecting “Yes” brings the user to the update payment details page. Selecting “No” as a merchant through Dashboard redirects the user back to the Subscription Details page. Selecting “No” as a customer through the copied link from the merchant brings up a pop-up containing the merchant’s contact information as entered on the Merchant Account page, accessed through the Admin menu (Figure 40).

Customers

Add a Customer

Clicking on the blue “Add Customer” button brings the user to a page where they can create new customers. The fields that are marked with asterisks are required and will turn red if clicked on and not filled in (Figure 41). If the billing and shipping addresses are the same, users can click on the “Copy Billing Address” button to auto-fill in the information from the billing address section to the shipping address section. Once finished creating the customer, clicking on the blue “Create” button finishes the customer creation process and the create button becomes an enabled blue “Edit” button.

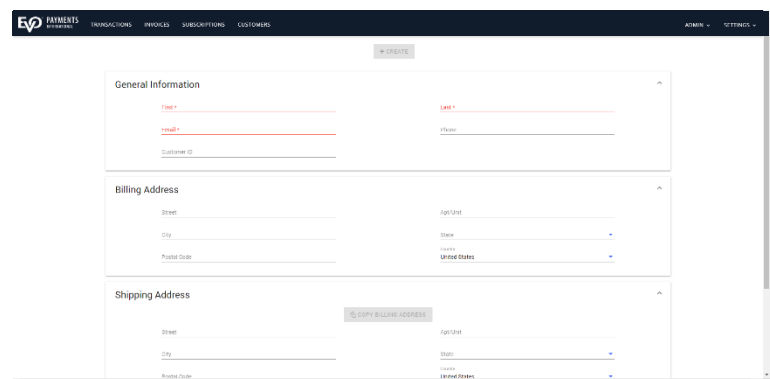
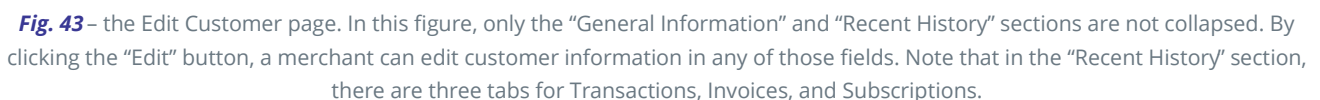
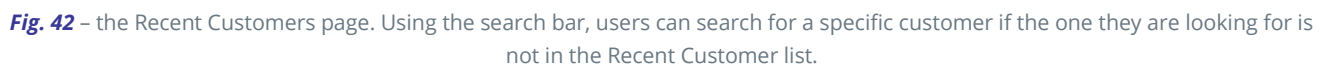

Clicking on the “Customers” heading next to the EVO Payments logo brings the user to the Recent Customers page (Figure 42). Here, the user can view the list of newly created customers or search for a specific customer via email address, phone number, customer ID, or billing postal code. Clicking on a customer from the list or search results takes the user to a Customer Information page. From this page, merchants can view and edit customer information, as well as view details related to their most recent 10 transactions, invoices, or subscriptions (Figure 43).



Wallet Customer Creation

The EVO Snap* platform will automatically generate a Wallet Customer Account when a payment is processed using a new PAN or card number. This account saves with the cardholder's first and last name only. If a merchant wishes to use this cardholder for any future invoicing, the cardholder's email address must be added to their associated customer details, otherwise the merchant will not be allowed to create an invoice or subscription for that specific customer.

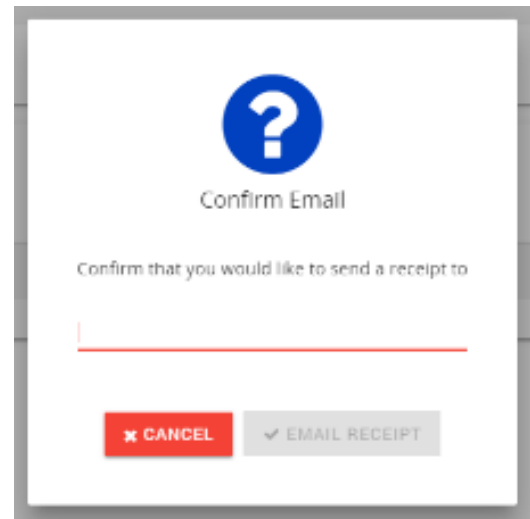


Fig. 44 – the Email Receipt pop-up. This pop-up is accessed by clicking on the "Email Receipt" button on a Payment Details page.

Should the cardholder request a receipt, the cardholder must provide an email address and the merchant can provide their receipt by going to the transaction page for that payment and clicking on the "Email Receipt" button (Figure 44).

Roles and Permissions

In this current version of Dashboard, all merchants will be on-boarded with the Merchant Admin role. Merchants are unable to change their own assigned role's permissions – if a merchant wishes to have higher permissions granted, please contact Customer Support at TS@evopayments.com.

Note: if a customer's information was updated after an invoice or subscription was created, a new invoice or subscription must be created – invoices and subscriptions do not automatically update to reflect updated customer information.

The following information outlines those higher permissions accessible through the Admin drop-down menu:

Admin

The Admin drop-down menu has four sections included: Merchants, Roles, Catalog, and Request New User.

Merchants

The Merchants option in the Admin drop-down menu brings the user to a page with a list of merchants (Figure 45).

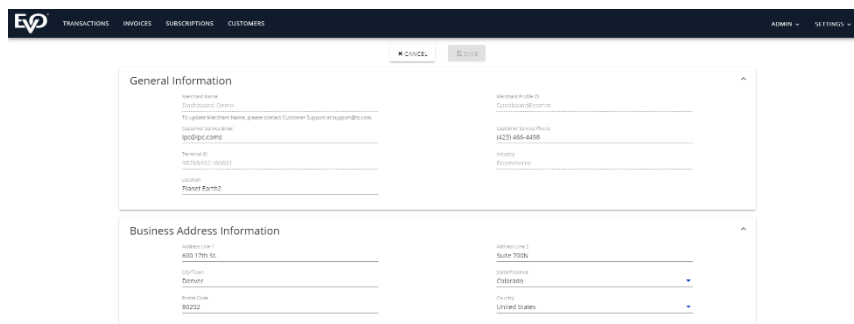

Clicking on one of the merchants in the list brings the user to that merchant's general information page (Figure 46). General information about the merchant, such as customer service email, customer service phone number, and location can all be edited from this page, but merchant profile ID, terminal ID, and industry type cannot be changed; merchant name can only be changed by contacting the technical support team at TS@evopayments.com.

The merchant's business address information can also be edited – this information is what appears in the top left corner of invoices and subscriptions, as well as emailed receipts.

Note: if a merchant's business address information was updated after an invoice or subscription was created, a new invoice or subscription must be created – invoices and subscriptions do not automatically update to reflect updated merchant information.

Roles

Again, for this version of Dashboard, all merchants will be on-boarded as a Merchant Admin by default. However, in future versions of Dashboard, roles will be broken out into Master Merchant Admin, Master Merchant User, Merchant Admin, and Merchant User, with Master Merchant Admin being the highest level role available and Merchant User being the lowest level role available.

Catalog

Clicking on the “Catalog” option in the Admin drop down menu brings the user to a page with a list of catalog items (Figure 47). Merchants can search for a specific catalog item by description, code/SKU, unit price, tax rate, or date updated. There are also quick navigation options for creating an invoice, adding a new catalog item, and deleting multiple catalog items.

Clicking on “Add Catalog Item” brings the user to a page where they can enter details about their new catalog item, such as code/SKU, unit price, tax rate, and item description (Figure 48).

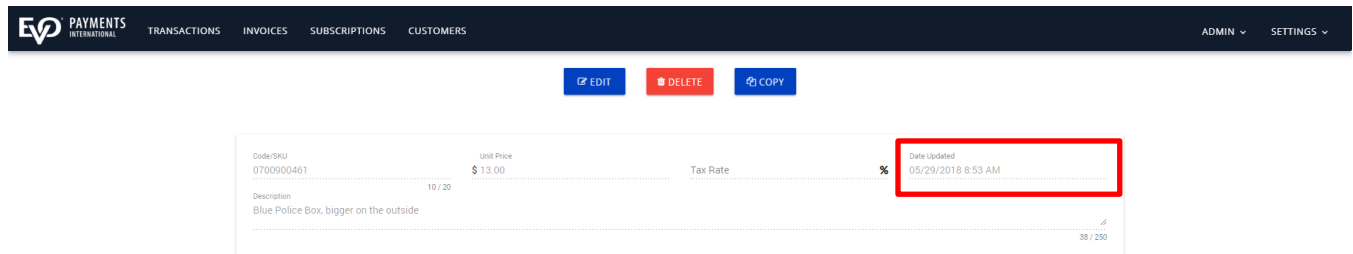


Fig. 49 - the Catalog Item Details page, with the “Date Updated” section boxed in red.

Once the required fields are filled in, clicking the “Create” button adds the catalog item and adds a uneditable “Date Updated” field to the details where the date and time of item creation can be seen (Figure 49). From this Catalog Item Details page, the merchant can edit, delete, or copy the catalog item, each of which are explained in more detail below.

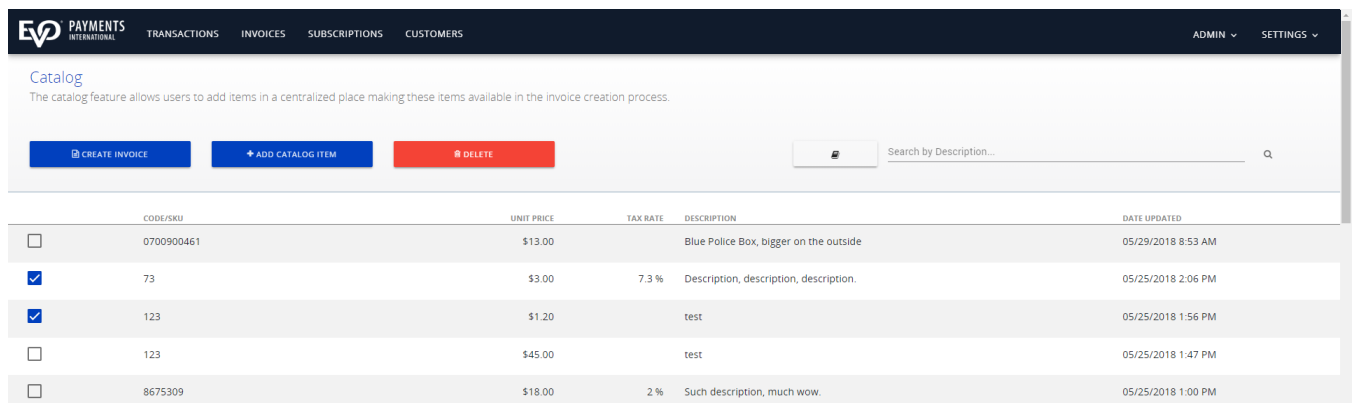


Fig. 50 - the Catalog page showing the multi-delete function.

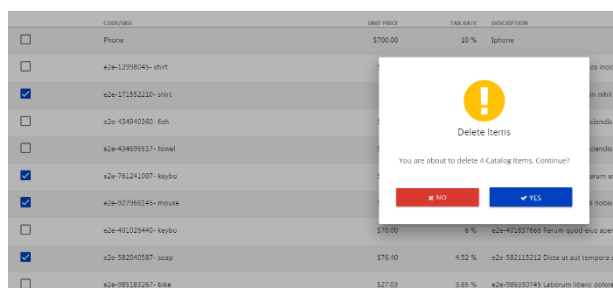
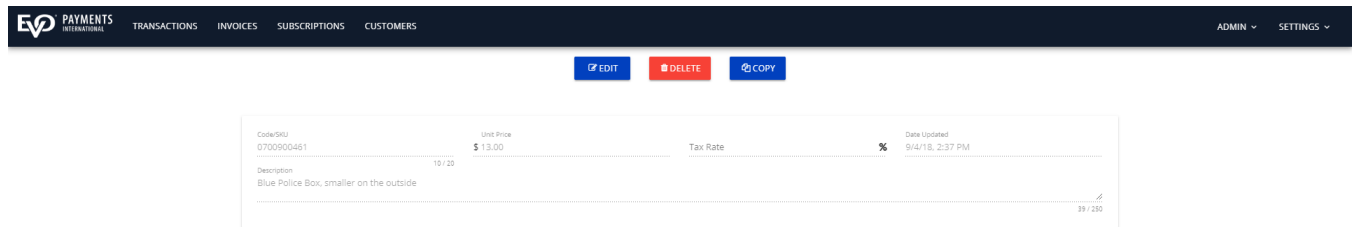


Fig. 51 - the confirmation pop-up for the multi-delete functionality.

Selecting “Multi-Delete” brings up a column of checkboxes, with one next to each catalog item. Checking one or more of the boxes changes the “Multi-Delete” button into a red “Delete” button that enables the user to delete multiple catalog items at once (Figure 50 and 51). To remove the column of checkboxes, uncheck all the boxes and click on the blue “Multi-Delete” button again, or navigate away from the list and back to it again .

Clicking on a specific catalog item from the list brings the user to a page with details about that item (Figure 52). From there, the merchant can edit the catalog item information, such as code/SKU, unit price, tax rate, and item description. Editing and saving any of these fields will update the “Date Updated” field for that catalog item.



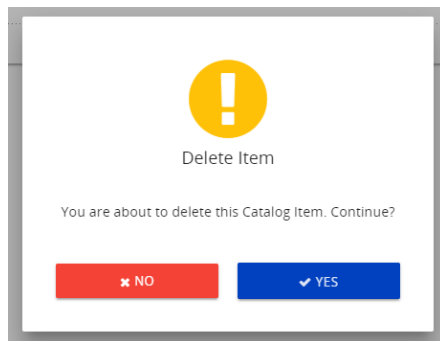

The merchant can also delete the catalog item – clicking the red “Delete” button brings up a confirmation message (Figure 53) and, once confirmed, will then navigate back to the main catalog page with that catalog entry deleted.

Additionally, merchants can copy the existing catalog item. Clicking “Copy” brings the user to a similar looking page as the Add a Catalog Item page, though the fields are already populated with the same content as the catalog item that was copied. Here, the merchant can edit any fields they desire before creating the copied catalog item. Please note that merchants are not required to change any fields as Dashboard does allow for duplicate entries for catalog items.

Request New User

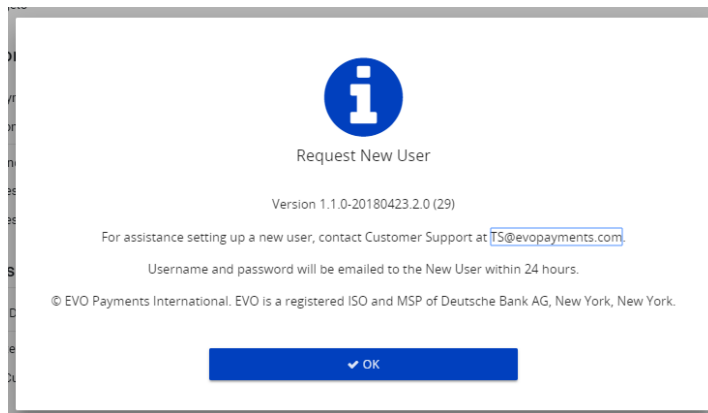


Fig. 54 (left) – the “Request New User” pop-up, which explains what steps need to be taken in order to set up a new Dashboard user account. Merchants must contact Customer Support in order to set up a Dashboard user account.

Clicking on the “Request New User” option in the Admin drop-down menu opens a pop-up explaining how to set up a new merchant account (Figure 54). In this current version of Dashboard, merchants must contact Customer Support at TS@evopayments.com in order to set up a new Dashboard user account.

Permissions

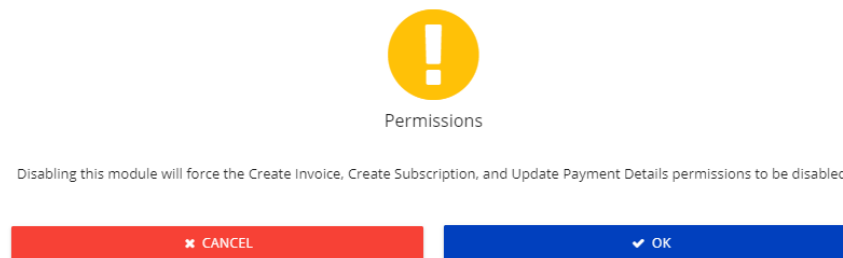


Fig. 56 – the warning pop-up that appears when attempting to disable either the overall “Customers Module” or the specific “Edit Customer” module and the resulting permission settings when the “OK” button is clicked. Clicking “Cancel” on the warning pop-up will return the permission settings to their previous positions.

Due to the Dashboard workflow, some permissions are dependent on others. For example, the process of creating an invoice or subscription and the ability to edit a customer are interrelated. Thus, in the permissions page for a user (Figure 55), when a user attempts to turn off the specific “Edit Customer” module or overall “Customers Module”, a pop-up appears warning the user that disabling either module also disables the “Create Invoice” module (Figure 56). Permissions that are interdependent on others will present a warning pop-up when changes are attempted by the user.

Another important permission to note is the “Transactions Module”. If this module is disabled, transaction features will be disabled across all Dashboard pages, not just the Transaction specific pages. “Related Transactions” details on customer and invoice pages will be disabled and hidden, as well.

Settings

Clicking on Settings in the top right corner of the Dashboard homepage opens a drop-down menu with three options: My Account, About, and Logout.

Note: Depending on the user’s permissions, a fourth Configuration option may be available in the drop-down menu.

My Account

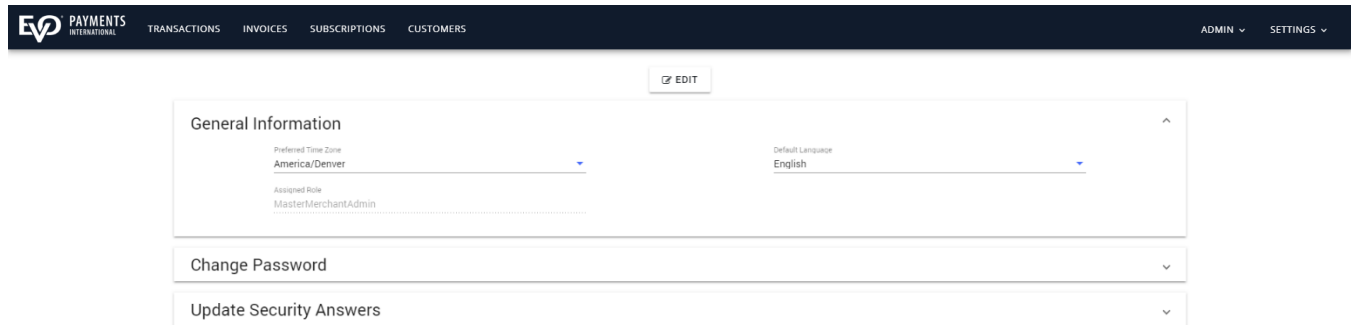


Fig. 57 – the My Account page. Merchant account information can be edited here, assuming the merchant has the required permissions. Required fields will turn red if clicked on and left blank.

Clicking on My Account from the Settings drop-down menu brings the user to a page with their account information (Figure 57). General information, such as preferred time zone and default language can be edited.

Users also have the option on this page to change their password. They must correctly enter their current password, otherwise their password will not be updated. Please note that passwords must have at least 7 characters, an uppercase letter, a lowercase letter, a number, and a special character in order to be accepted, and the new password cannot be the same as any of the four previous passwords.

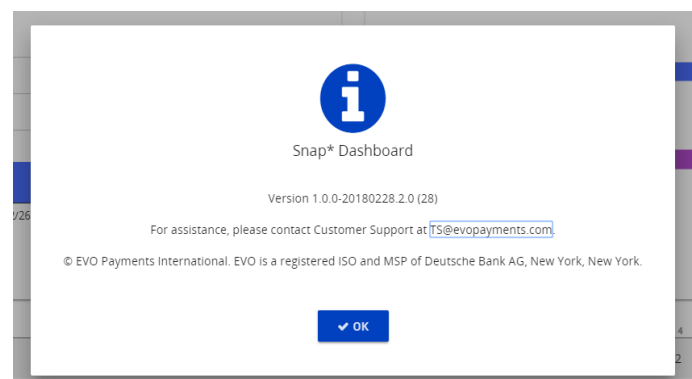
Security answers can be updated from this page, as well. The current password must be entered correctly before any security answers can be updated – security questions cannot be changed. As mentioned in the First Time Login section, users must select three different security questions to use to access their account in the case of a forgotten password.

Note: If a user does not log in to their account for 90 days, they will be locked out of Dashboard and must contact Customer Support at TS@evopayments.com in order to regain access to their account.

About

The About option in the Settings drop-down menu brings up the pop-up displayed in Figure 58. This pop-up gives information about EVO Dashboard, such as the version number and the customer support email address and/or phone number (depending on the configuration settings).

Session Expiration

Note: The Configuration option in the Settings drop-down menu is only available to users with the Master Merchant Admin role.

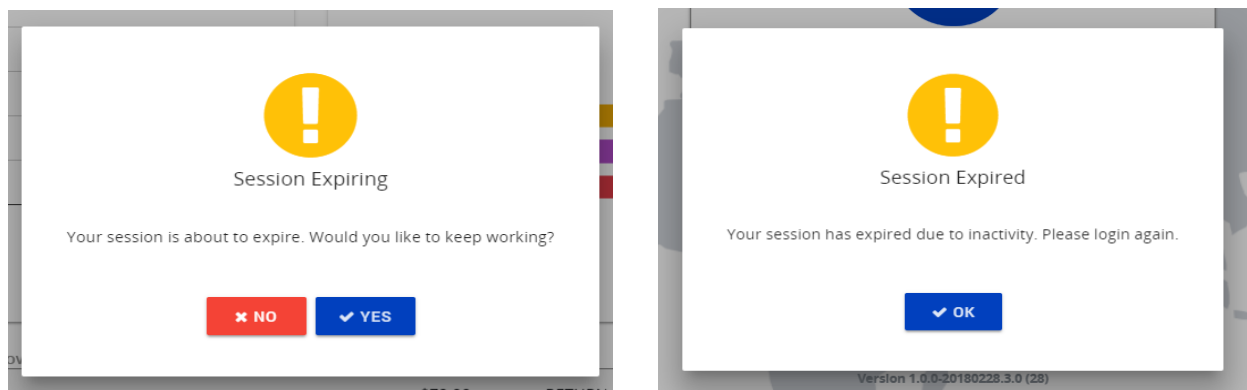


Fig. 59 (left) and Fig. 60 (right) – the pop-ups that appear upon warning of session expiration and session expiration.

If the user is inactive for more than 14 minutes, a pop-up will appear warning the user that their session is about to expire and asking if they would like to continue working (Figure 59). If the “Yes” option is not clicked within 1 minute of the pop-up appearing, then Dashboard will automatically sign out the user, displaying a pop-up stating that the session has expired (Figure 60). In order to continue using Dashboard, the merchant must sign back in.

Configuration

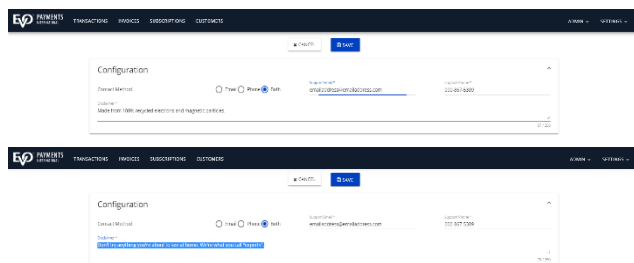


Fig. 61 (left) – The Configuration page where information such as support email, support phone number, and copyright disclaimer can all be edited. The information entered here will be displayed in the About pop-up, error messages, and on the login screen for all merchant users.

The Configuration page contains information that is used throughout Dashboard to identify the merchant. The editable fields on this page, such as support email, support phone, and copyright disclaimer, are displayed in the About pop-up for all merchant users (Figure 61), error messages where the user is directed to contact support; the disclaimer can also be found on the login screen. Merchants can choose to display their contact email, phone number, or both using the buttons. All the fields are required and will turn red if clicked on and left blank.
